4-H OUTSTANDING LEADER RECOGNITION

Outstanding Intermediate and Outstanding Senior Leaders

Intermediate Leaders are 4-H members that should be in at least 6th grade August 31 of the current 4-H year and have three (3) years of 4-H experience. The intermediate leader works as an assistant to and under the supervision of an adult or senior leader. The 4-H Club Manager Guide Manual outlines the many different types of responsibilities that an intermediate leader can assume.

Senior Leaders are 4-H members that should be in at least 9th grade as of August 31 of the current 4-H year. They should be able to accept full responsibility for a 4-H club, project group, short-term group, or special activity. They must have served as an active intermediate leader one (1) year immediately prior and have three (3) years of 4-H experience. It is recommended that intermediate and senior leaders work with younger 4-Hers, in the range of third grade to fifth grade.

- Each club may nominate <u>one (1) outstanding intermediate leader and one (1) outstanding</u> <u>senior leader.</u> A written application for the award must be completed and signed by the nominee. The club manager will sign and submit the application to the Extension Office by July 1st unless advised otherwise by the Awards and Recognition Committee. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. The Awards and Recognition Committee will review the nominees and select four (4) outstanding intermediate leader finalists and four (4) outstanding senior leader finalists. Finalists will be based on the following criteria:

*Leadership participation in 4-H and other activities *What 4-H members have gained as a result of this leader's work. *How the leader has contributed to the success of the local 4-H club with which he/she has worked and the county program.

- 3. The Fort Bend 4-H Adult Leaders, Parents and Friends will select two (2) Outstanding intermediate leaders and two (2) outstanding senior leaders from the finalists during their meeting immediately prior to the Annual Awards Banquet. Voting will be by written ballot. The results will be secret and announced at the Annual Awards Banquet.
- 4. The outstanding intermediate and outstanding senior award can be received only once.
- 5. A Gold Clover will be awarded to these recipients (2 intermediates and 2 seniors) provided by the Fort Bend 4-H Adult Leaders, Parents and Friends.

Outstanding Adult Leaders

Adult Leaders must have been a 4-H leader and/or manager for five (5) years.

1. Each club may nominate <u>two (2) outstanding adult leaders</u>. A written application for the award must be completed. The club manager will sign and submit the application to the Extension Office by July 1st unless advised otherwise by the Awards and Recognition Committee. **NO EXCEPTIONS**.

2. The Awards and Recognition Committee will review the nominees and select four (4) outstanding adult leader finalists. Finalists will be based on the following criteria:

*Leadership participation in 4-H and other activities. *What 4-H members have gained as a result of this leader's work. *How the leader has contributed to the success of the local4-H club with which he/she has worked and the county program.

- 3. The County Youth Council will select two (2) outstanding adult leaders from the finalists during their meeting immediately prior to the Annual Awards Banquet. Voting will be by written ballot. The results will be secret and announced at the Annual Awards Banquet.
- 4. The outstanding adult award can be received only once within a ten (10) year period of time.
- 5. A Gold Clover will be awarded to these recipients provided by the Fort Bend 4-H Adult Leaders, Parents and Friends.

HALL OF FAME

- 1. The Hall of Fame Award may be presented to an individual, business, company or organization (not a present 4-H leader or 4-H parent) that has contributed to the success of the county 4-H program.
- 2. Each club may submit an application, deadline July 1st unless advised otherwise by the Awards and Recognition Committee. Submission of application does not necessarily mean an award will be presented.
- 3. The Awards and Recognition Committee will be responsible for reviewing applications and selecting two (2) finalists. Selection of the recipient will be by the Fort Bend 4-H Adult Leaders, <u>Parents and Friends</u> during the meeting immediately prior to the Annual Awards Banquet. Voting shall be by written ballot.
- 4. An award may be presented to the recipient at the Annual Awards Banquet.
